Chair's Corner



"Supporting Wimborne Hospital to provide excellent care".

Dear Supporters,

It won't come as any surprise to you that the NHS is facing

considerable challenges in 2025, including funding, staffing and waiting times. Wimborne Hospital (Dorset HealthCare Trust) continues to work closely with Bournemouth Hospital and University Hospitals Dorset to streamline services and to play their part in responding to these challenges. Examples of this include additional endoscopy sessions and busy theatre lists at Wimborne Hospital. The Radiology Department continue to provide an excellent service and were awarded "Quality Services In Imaging Accreditation" following an inspection in October 2024. The Friends have agreed to fund improvements works for the Ultrasound Room and this will take place in early 2025.

Members will be aware that we purchased an acre of land adjacent to the Hospital in 2024 to increase car parking as new services are brought in. There has been a slight delay with the phasing of the car park works because of drainage issues leading to a necessary redesign of the plans. We are now expecting a start date of April 2025.

We await with keen interest the NHS 10 Year Health Plan which is due to be published in the Spring 2025. Be assured that the Friends of Victoria Hospital, Wimborne will update you all in terms of the proposed changes and the role of the Hospital in delivering these changes. Thank you all for your continued support and I look forward to meeting many of you during 2025.

CAR PARK DEVELOPMENT

Although there has been little work to be seen on the land for the Car Park, much has been happening behind the scenes.

Work on preparing for the Car Park build has been going ahead including Bat and Bird surveys and there have had to be some changes made to the detail of the plans around water drainage which has been time consuming. It is hoped by Dorset Healthcare Trust that the contract will go out to tender at the end of January.

Once the tenders are returned and a contractor selected, we are advised that work is targeted to begin in April.

Trustee Changes

Linda Hollingbury was appointed as a Trustee in October 2024. She comes to us with years of experience as a senior NHS manager. Her focus will be on Fundraising and Events and she is looking forward to working with Trustees and the local community to improve services and facilities at the Hospital.



Melanie Fawcett has stepped down as a Trustee after 7 years in December 2024. Melanie said that she had always enjoyed her time with The Friends but with a house move imminent, she feels it is time to step back from that role. David Pope, President, thanked Melanie for her invaluable help over the years and wished her well for the future.



Wimborne Hospital Achieves National Recognition

Hanham Ward, has been awarded a national Gold Standards Framework (GSF) Quality Hallmark Award in recognition of the excellent end of life care they provide and we were very pleased to be able to fund their attendance to collect the award.

Debbie Straw, Matron and three members of staff received the award at the GSF annual conference and awards ceremony on Friday 27th September at BMA House in London - a celebration of the UK's exceptional health and social care providers for care in the final year of life.

Victoria Hospital, Wimborne was one of 140 organisations from across the country receiving the award in London (98 care homes, 1 primary care team, 5 domiciliary care agencies, 8 retirement villages, 1 prison healthcare team and 27 hospital wards).

Lord Darzi Report on NHS

"The NHS is in critical condition, but its vital signs are strong" (Lord Darzi—Independent Investigation of the NHS in England September 2024).

His investigation, commissioned by the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care indicated that people are struggling to see their GPs, that the NHS is failing to meet waiting targets across all services, with long waits for mental health, community support, hospital appointments and cancer care.

The 10 Year health Plan , to be published in the spring 2025 is posed to deliver 3 big shifts for the NHS:

From Hospital to Community
From analogue to digital

From sickness to prevention
